

## CURRICULUM VITAE

Borut Miklavčič, born 11 January 1944 in Ljubljana, graduate of the Faculty of Social Sciences. In his professional career to date, he has held positions in the economic sector as a member of the SMELT management board during the period 1990–1996, where he was involved in preparing and implementing larger investment projects abroad, which also included cooperation with the EBRD and other banks.

During the period 1990–2002, holding the post of director of Savske Elektrarne (the Sava River hydroelectric power stations), he participated in the construction of the hydroelectric power station Vrhovo. In the same period he was also a member of the assembly of the Chamber of Commerce and Industry of Slovenia.

During the years 1985–1990, he was consul-general in Celovec (Klagenfurt), Austria.

In the field of health, he was employed as assistant director of the University Medical Centre Ljubljana; prior to that, in the period 1982–1985, he was also president of the National Health Committee (i.e. ministry) of the Republic of Slovenia. During this time he also participated in two projects of the World Health Organisation.

At the 2003 meeting of the assembly of the Health Insurance Institute of Slovenia, he was elected director of the institute; this election was given the necessary consent by the National Assembly. He successfully discharged his duties as director until April 2007. Under his leadership, the institute maintained the favourable regard of the Slovenian Court of Audit throughout his mandate. Since 2005, the institute has had a positive financial balance and was recognised for merit by the Commission for Public Finance Control at the National Assembly of the Republic of Slovenia. The Ministry of Public Administration awarded the institute the 2007 Good Practice Award in the area of civil service.

Mr Miklavčič was also president of the University Medical Centre Board and member of the boards of the Institute of Oncology and the Institute for Rehabilitation.

A major part of his professional career was devoted to the area of foreign and national investment management. One of the greatest investment projects he has managed was the construction of the "Cankarjev Dom", the cultural and conference centre in Ljubljana during the last three years of its construction.

The last two years he has held an honorary position as president of the Red Cross of Slovenia.
