

## **Ernst van Koesveld**

Ernst van Koesveld is senior coordinator economics and strategy of the General Financial and Economic Policy Department of the Ministry of Finance, the Netherlands. He is working on a wide range of policy issues, including labor market and welfare state reforms. He manages an internal think tank of the Ministry of Finance with the aim to strengthen the evidence-based policy making of the central government.

After his study (development economics and public finance), he started his working career at the Ministry of Economic Affairs. In 1998, he moved to Lithuania to work as a policy advisor and programme coordinator for the UN Development Programme. Two years later, he continued this work in Vietnam, dealing issues related to aid flows, private sector development and human development issues. In 2002, he returned to the Netherlands to become deputy head of the International Economics and Financial Institutions Division at the Ministry of Finance, where he was closely involved in discussions on shaping the policy of IMF and the World Bank (also as a Dutch Finance participant in the IDA14 negotiations).

He has published several articles and reports on economic policy matters, including the taxation and the labor market, and the international financial architecture.
