Gary Burtless holds the Whitehead Chair in Economic Studies at the Brookings Institution, Washington, DC, USA, where he has been a Senior Fellow since 1983. His research focuses on labor markets, public finance, aging, saving behavior, and the income distribution. He is editor of the Brookings-Wharton Papers on Urban Affairs. Burtless received his college degree from Yale University in 1972 and a Ph.D. in economics from M.I.T. in 1977.

He is co-author of *Globaphobia: Confronting Fears about Open Trade* (1998); *The Long Term Effects of Welfare-to-Work Programs* (1995), *Growth with Equity: Economic Policymaking for the Next Century* (1993), and *Can America Afford to Grow Old?* (1989). Burtless edited and contributed to *Aging Societies: The Global Dimension* (1998), *A Future of Lousy Jobs? The Changing Structure of U.S. Wages* (1990), *Work, Health and Income Among the Elderly* (1987) and *Retirement and Economic Behavior* (1984). He currently co-edits the Brookings-Wharton Papers on Urban Affairs and serves on the editorial boards of other economics and public policy journals.
