

Milan Vodopivec

Milan Vodopivec, a Slovenian national, received a Ph.D. in economics from the University of Maryland, College Park, in 1989. He joined the World Bank in 1989, where he has been working in the Research Department and the Human Development Network. During his leave from the Bank (1995-98) he served as a State Undersecretary at the Ministry of Labor of Slovenia, and a teacher and dean of a GEA College of Entrepreneurship, Portorož, Slovenia. He has been heavily involved in the World Bank's work on labor markets in transition economies, and he conducted two comprehensive research projects on labor market adjustment (on Slovenia and Estonia).

He has published widely, including in the *European Economic Review*, *Economic Development and Cultural Change*, *Labor Economics*, and *World Bank Economic Review*. His current research interests are employment dynamics (using matched employer-employee data) and income support systems for the unemployed; other interests include fighting the monopoly in the Slovenian higher education.
